Pre-NAPLEX testing:

- When registering for the Pre-NAPLEX make sure your name reads just as it does on your Verifiable document (Driver's License) that will also be used when applying to the Board of Pharmacy for Pharmacist licensure after graduation and, as it will read on your diploma. This will be the name you used when you registered for the PCOA on the NABP website as a 3rd year. If you have an updated name, please contact NABP and ask how to proceed.
- Computer-based exam of 100 questions with 140 minutes allotted to finish
- Test must be completed entirely once you begin
- Students will be unable to review questions or change answers once you confirm an answer choice
- Score report is available immediately following completion of examination and must be saved at that time. You must download the score report to be able to upload this to the e-value system.
- Although students will not be penalized if they do poorly on the practice exam, it is in the best interest of each student to take it seriously in order to accurately assess their own strengths and weaknesses
- Students who wish to re-take the practice exam must pay for it themselves. The \$65 fee
 will not be covered by MUSC. There is a maximum of two attempts at taking the preNAPLEX.

MUSC must have this documentation in place by March 30, 2020; MUSC will withhold processing of individual student Board of Pharmacy licensing exam materials until the pre-NAPLEX score report is received and pre-MPJE score report is received. Please note you cannot go back into the system after finishing the exam; therefore, these score reports MUST be saved immediately after taking the pre-NAPLEX, pre-MPJE. This information will be used only to look at overall class statistics; individual scores will not be made public or be utilized in punitive manner by the college.
