ASHP Student Leadership Award	<p>This program recognizes and celebrates the contributions of students who represent the very best attributes and accomplishments of ASHP student members. ASHP offers up to twelve awards annually. Pharmacy students in the second through fourth professional years are eligible to apply.</p> <p>The award consists of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An award plaque • A \$2000 cash award provided by the ASHP Research and Education Foundation <p>Eligibility</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Applicants must be a full-time pharmacy student enrolled in a professional Doctor of Pharmacy program at an ACPE-accredited college of pharmacy • Applicants must be an ASHP member in good standing • Applicants must have a cumulative grade point average of a least 2.75 on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent grading system) • Applicants must have completed at least one academic year in their professional pharmacy program • Students who have received an ASHP Student Leadership Award in the past or who are currently serving on an ASHP Council, the Commission on Affiliate Relations or the Pharmacy Student Forum Executive Committee are not eligible to apply
ACAP Walmart Health Equity Scholarship	<p>The Walmart Health Equity Scholarship for Pharmacy Students will be awarded to 7 outstanding Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) degree students who are accepted or enrolled in the professional curriculum at a U.S. college or school of pharmacy. Selected awardees must demonstrate leadership, academic success, and a commitment to serving rural or medically underserved patient populations. Each awardee will receive a single \$5,000 scholarship.</p>

	<p>Eligibility Requirements</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Accepted into a professional Pharm.D. program for the upcoming fall entering class • Enrolled as a P1, P2, or P3 Pharm.D. student in a 4-year program • Students must demonstrate leadership, academic success, and a commitment to serving rural, medically underserved areas or populations (<u>MUA/Ps</u>), or Health Professional Shortage Areas (<u>HPSAs</u>) upon graduation from a Pharm.D. degree program • Only US citizens and permanent US residents are eligible • Students must be in good standing at their current (or most recent) institution at the time of application • Students must submit a completed application by the deadline • If a scholarship is awarded to an accepted (not yet enrolled) pharmacy student, the award will be granted to the institution after the individual has started classes in the Pharm.D. program. These students will be ineligible to apply for this scholarship again in the future
<p>The American Society of Pharmacognosy</p>	<p>Offers travel and research grants and awards. Eligibility differs depending on the award.</p>
<p>AAPA-AFPE Gateway to Research Scholarships</p>	<p>This scholarship is for pharmacy students currently enrolled in an ACPE accredited School of Pharmacy. The primary goal of the Gateway to Research Scholarship program is to help students gain an understanding of the importance of research by enabling them to apply that knowledge to improve their clinical skills.</p> <p>Eligibility</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident • a full-time student who is <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ enrolled in a Pharm.D. program

NCPA Foundation Scholarships	<p>All pharmacy students who are NCPA student members are eligible to apply for ONE of the NCPA Foundation Scholarships per academic year. The student must be enrolled in an accredited U.S. school or college of pharmacy on a full-time basis during the term that the scholarship is awarded. Health Professions Program Indian Health Service	<p>Health Professions Scholarship: Recipients must be a member of a federally recognized American Indian Tribe or Alaska Native village only.</p> <p>Academic Requirement</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be a high school graduate or the equivalent • Have a minimum 2.0 GPA • Be capable of completing a health profession degree program

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Intend to serve Indian people as a health professional in your chosen discipline
Hispanic Scholarship Fund (HSF)	<p>Eligibility</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Must be of Hispanic heritage • U.S. citizen, permanent legal resident, or DACA • Minimum of 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent) for high school students; minimum of 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent) for college and graduate students • Plan to enroll full-time in an accredited, public or not-for-profit, four-year university, or graduate school, in the US, for the 2023-2024 academic year • Submit the FAFSA or state-based financial aid forms (if applicable)
CVS Health Minority Scholarship	<p>The CVS Health Minority Scholarship for Pharmacy Students will be awarded to five outstanding underrepresented minority (URM) students who have been accepted into a Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) program for the 2023-2024 academic year OR were enrolled in their first (P1) year of the professional phase of the PharmD degree program during the 2022-2023 academic year. URM pharmacy students are identified as black or African American, Hispanic or Latino, American Indian, Native Hawaiian, and/or Pacific Islander students who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents. Selected awardees must demonstrate leadership, academic success, and a commitment to advancing the profession of pharmacy and patient care. Each awardee will receive a single \$8,000 scholarship.</p> <p>Eligibility</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Accepted applicants must be accepted into a PharmD program for the 2023-2024 academic year OR enrolled as a first year (P1) PharmD student during the 2022-2023 academic year at an ACPE pre-candidate, candidate, or accredited AACCP member institution • Student must be a URM student. AACCP identifies URM individuals in pharmacy as black or African American, Hispanic or Latino, American Indian, Native Hawaiian, and/or Pacific

	<p>Islander students who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student must demonstrate leadership, academic success, and a commitment to advancing the pharmacy profession and patient care. • GPA for current degree program must be 2.0 or greater on a 4.0 scale. Applicants from schools with other grading systems are still eligible to apply for the scholarship. See the Applicant Instructions for more information • Student must submit a completed application by the deadline • If a scholarship is awarded to an accepted (not yet enrolled) pharmacy student, the award will be granted to the institution after the individual has started classes in the PharmD program. These students will be ineligible to apply for this scholarship again in the future
<p>Thermo Fisher Scientific Antibody Scholarship Program</p>	<p>Enrolled as a Graduate Student or Undergraduate Student at an accredited U.S. college or university and have a declared major of biology, chemistry, bio-chemistry or a related life science field. Applicants must have a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA.</p>
<p>APhA Foundation Student Scholarship Program</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete at least one academic year in the professional sequence of courses • Earn a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.75 on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent grading system) in professional coursework during pharmacy school • Be an active member in the APhA Academy of Student Pharmacists (APhA-ASP). The applicant must show active participation in his or her chapter's activities but is not required to hold a leadership position.
